Gentlemen:

As previously discussed, and as a result of a survey of the duties of the classifications involved, Company proposes to modify the wage rates of the First Operator classifications at Station F, Berkeley, and Station G, El Cerrito as follows:

Station F - Berkeley

From Schedule II \$125.90 per week
to Schedule III \$120.20 per week

Station G - El Cerrito

From Schedule II \$125.90 per week
to Schedule I \$129.60 per week

Company proposes that the effective date of the change for First Operators at Station F be September 1, 1959, for employees entering the classification after that date. For employees entering the classification before September 1, 1959, the effective date shall be the first of the month after four vacancies have been posted in Schedule II substations in East Bay Division, or December 31, 1961, whichever is later. We further propose that the provisions of Section 206.9 of the Physical Agreement be made available to incumbent First Operators at Station F so that they may return to a substation in the Schedule II on an accelerated basis.

Company proposes that the effective date of the change in schedule at Station G be October 1, 1960.

Our proposed letter agreement dated March 16, 1960, is hereby withdrawn.
