Gentlemen:

This letter cancels and supersedes our letter of August 28, 1968 on this same subject.

Mr. J. F. Stowe, Utilityman in the Water Department at Camp 5, Sacramento Division, has retired, effective July 1, 1968. Company proposes to reclassify the resulting vacancy to Utility Water Systems Repairman with the following job definition:

Utility Water Systems Repairman - Camp 5

An employee who performs the duties of a Water Systems Repairman, including the duties of a Heavy Tractor Driver, with particular emphasis on the maintenance and repair of Company cottages and buildings at Camp 5. In addition, he repairs and maintains hand tools. When assigned to maintain the telephone line between El Dorado Power House and El Dorado Canal Intake, he shall be paid at a wage rate equivalent to the top rate of Apprentice Lineman.

This employee shall be paid the wage rate of a Water Systems Repairman and shall be considered as being in such classification for promotion and demotion.

If you are in accord with the foregoing and agree thereto, please so indicate in the space provided below and return one executed copy of this letter to Company.
