Gentlemen:

Company proposes to abolish the classification of Mechanic (Gas Plant) in Grass Valley and establish the classification of Utility Compressor Engineer at that location. The proposed job definition is as follows:

0503 Utility Compressor Engineer - Gas Department - Grass Valley

An employee who performs the duties of a Compressor Engineer and operates the propane air machines at the plant. In addition, he maintains the gas making machines and compressors, regulators, holders, and tanks and related equipment at the plant.

For wage rate and bidding or demotion purposes, this employee is considered as a Compressor Engineer.

Company also proposes to reclassify Mr. N. J. Angove from Mechanic to Utility Compressor Engineer at \$175.45 per week, under the provisions of Section 205.19 of the Agreement dated September 1, 1952.
