DIVISION AND GENERAL OFFICE BUILDING DEPARTMENTS

0660 BUILDING MAINTENANCE SUBFOREMAN

An employee who is a working foreman and who supervises employees engaged in the operation, maintenance, minor construction and reconstruction and upkeep of buildings, furniture and fixtures, and mechanical and electrical equipment herein. He shall have the personal qualifications of leadership and supervisory ability, the job qualifications of a Building Maintenanceman, and be fimiliar with the buildings to which he is assigned and with Company's maintenance and safety standards, accounting procedures, and other applicable rules and procedures.

He shall be able to read blueprints and to operate a Company vehicle. He may be required to refinish furniture and other routine work. He may also be required to direct the work of other Building Department employees.

Under indirect supervision, he may also be required to perform janitorial work such as cleaning, replacing light globes or tubes, moving furniture, changing washers in plumbing fixtures and replacing or repairing window blinds.
