Gentlemen:

For a number of years, San Francisco Division has assigned the collection of bills to a single Troubleman assigned the hours of work of 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. The Troubleman who was voluntarily assigned this work was not eligible for emergency call-outs under Title 212 procedures. The Troubleman who was assigned this work is about to retire and the Division and each of the Troublemens in the District would like to see this practice continued for the "cuts and non-pay Troublemens slot." In other words, the Troublemens do not want to see this work rotated among them.

The Company proposes to assign Troubleman C. R. Layton to the "cuts and non-pay Troubleman slot" on a permanent basis with the workweek and hours of work of 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, and remove him from the emergency call-out procedure. Troubleman C. R. Layton has requested assignment to this work and is agreeable to the above conditions.

It is our understanding that the local Business Representative, Mr. Frank Saxsenmeier, is in accord with this proposal.

If you are in accord with the foregoing and agree thereto, please so indicate in the space provided below and return one executed copy of this letter to the Company.
