

I, Malden R. Davis, am requesting for a transfer to Santa Rosa, Napa, or surrounding areas. I give my reasons as stated under the provisions of title ~~205.17~~ Job Bidding and Promotion. 301.16

Under these provisions I am concerned with the health of my wife and my unborn child.

Because of an allergy that my wife has had for sometime, she was on medication that has been known to cause some birth defects in Germany during World War II.

She has been in the hospital for two days for a possible miscarry. Her state of mind is a concern to me, as for a possible reoccurrence of the problem with a miscarry. We have no family in the area and no friends to rely on as to a problem which may occur during my working hours. If we were in Santa

Rosa my wife could call on our relatives for aid in case of an emergency.

I am not on expenses, so it would be impossible for me to live here in Eureka, and my wife & children in Santa Rosa. I hope my request will be accepted, as I value my job with P.G.E. Construction as I value my wife's health and the health of my unborn child.

With two children now, ages 4-3 years old, it's very hard on her, my wife has gone for days of deep depression and has been put on nerve medication.

Please take my request into consideration, as I wrote before I value my work with P.G.E. very highly.

Dear Sirs:

This patient has requested I write a letter to her future physician explaining her prenatal course and care.

Lynn has been upset by the fact that she was taking Enarax for a skin disorder under the care of Dr. Devine, a dermatologist in Eureka. When she became aware that there was literature about Enarax stating that it had caused deformities in mice under heavy doses she became worried about the possibility that she might have a deformed child. She was advised that Enarax has been shown to cause deformities in rats and mice, but only in excessive doses. There have been no known deformities in children born from humans from this medication to date. Nevertheless, she was changed to Tamaril to help to relieve the itching. The patient has continued to worry about the possibility of a deformed child and is highly nervous and anxious about this problem despite the fact that she has been reassured that it is very unlikely, and that the medication has been stopped.

The patient also was hospitalized for threatened abortion. (See copies of the hospital history, physical and records.) She has had several attacks of cramping since that time, always brought on by anxiety and nervous tension, particularly when there is a family problem with the children, etc., causing her to be emotionally upset.

The patient feels that she would be much more stable if she were near her parents in Santa Rosa and also that they would be a help in taking care of her children.

I am sending copies of the prenatal records of this patient, as well as the lab work and the hospitalization copies. If there are any other requests or if there is anything else that can be helpful from this office please notify me.
