Gentlemen:

Pursuant to Subsection 3.5 of the Agreement, Company proposes to modify the residency requirement, for Las Plumas District in North Valley Division as follows:

- Quincy Headquarters Response time shall remain 30 minutes to the Quincy headquarters, but will be extended to 45 minutes for persons living on the Canyon Dam side of Quincy.
- Canyon Dam Headquarters Response time shall remain 30 minutes to the Canyon Dam headquarters, but will be extended to 45 minutes for persons living on the Quincy side of Canyon Dam.

Las Plumas District is an all-electric service territory of over 1850 square miles in a mountainous area in the northeast section of PG&E's service territory. It has two headquarters located approximately 35 miles apart: Canyon Dam and Quincy. The Quincy headquarters is staffed with two Troubleman and a four person Electric T&D crew. The Canyon Dam headquarters has one Troubleman and a four person Electric T&D crew. The Troublemen work the District as one service area with the three Troublemen participating in an on-call rotation schedule that has the on-call person covering the entire District, not just their particular headquarters. Consequently, when the on-call Troublemen responds outside of his regular headquarters, the travel time exceeds the 30 minutes automotive travel time specified in Title 3.5.

As housing is limited in this area, it is not uncommon for employees to live outside the communities their regular headquarters is located in. Neither Quincy nor Canyon Dam are incorporated and there is a dearth of available housing. Thus, employees frequently must live more than 30 minutes automotive travel time to find suitable housing, but remain within the proposed 45 minute travel time. In addition, there is limited interest in Troubleman relief or upgrade. An expansion of the travel time would create a larger pool of employees to consider without compromising service.

Either party may terminate this agreement in its entirely by giving 30 days written notice to the other party at the local level.

This proposal has been discussed with Business Representative Mickey Harrington.
