Gentlemen:

The Company proposes to once again participate in *OaklandWorks* in East Bay Division. In 1995, the Company and Union agreed to the *OaklandWorks* Project in Letter Agreement 95-84. *OaklandWorks* is designed to provide worksite learning experiences for students enrolled in the Oakland Unified School District's Career Academies Magnet Program. The Career Academies program serves as a nationally recognized educational approach for career preparation for Oakland youth.

OaklandWorks is funded by the Oakland Unified School District. Students employed via this program will be paid by Oakland Unified for the services they provide the Company. The Company is providing career experience and development; no direct costs will be incurred as a result of participation.

East Bay Division's involvement in this program would be to have students observe the clerical bargaining-unit employees and then perform specific tasks as assigned by supervisors. (See attached list of tasks from 1995. Tasks for the current year will be similar.) Approximately 10 students, between the ages of 16-18 will be participating in the program for approximately 180 hours, from July 1 through August 30, 1996. This agreement will remain in effect throughout these dates.

The Company's participation in this program would be consistent with Section 24.2 of the Clerical Agreement, inasmuch as the assignments given to the students will not result in a reduction of bargaining-unit employees. The assignments given would be de minimis tasks to provide the students with specific skill development.

This proposal has been discussed with Union Business Representative Joel Ellioff.
