Gentlemen:

On September 6, 1979, Mr. William G. Woodward, a journeyman Lineman, sustained an industrial injury. On February 1, 1980, Mr. Woodward went on compensation injury. He returned to work on February 4, 1980, but went on compensation payroll indefinitely on April 28, 1980. On November 30, 1981, he returned to the Company on a trial basis as a Meter Reader. He completed the trial period but changed to a Service Representative on June 1, 1983. Since this time, Mr. Woodward's doctor has stated that Mr. Woodward can do work as a Patrolman.

Accordingly, and in an effort to put Mr. Woodward's skills and experience to optimal use, the Company proposes, pursuant to Section 205.19 of the Physical Agreement, to permanently place Mr. Woodward in a Patrolman position in the Colusa Office of the Colgate Division within Sacramento Valley Region.

Mr. Woodward's employment date is January 11, 1971. Pursuant to Subsection 112.10(c)(2) of the Physical Agreement, Mr. Woodward's rate of pay will be \$548.90 per week.

This matter has been discussed with Ed Fortier, Union Business Representative.
