Effective April 24, 1988, the Company plans on consolidating the Marysville Gas Load Center with the Sacramento Gas Load Center. As a result, the Company proposes the following pursuant to Sections 205.19 and 206.12 of the Physical Agreement:

1. The following employees and their classifications will be relocated from the Marysville Gas Load Center to the Sacramento Gas Load Center:

- 2. The above employees will be considered to be headquartered within the Colgate Division bidding unit in the application of Subsection 205.5 (d) for a period of one year following their report date to Sacramento.
- 3. The above employees were provided their Section 206.9 rights in December, 1987.
- 4. The above employees who move their household as a result of this relocation and otherwise qualify for the moving allowance as described in Section 206.8 of the Physical Agreement, will be reimbursed in accordance with those provisions, with the understanding that an employee experiencing a move need not relocate within a commutable distance. However, the move must relocate the employee reasonably closer to the new headquarters.

- 5. The remaining Pressure Operator, L. Rochholz, will be provided Lack of Work Title 206 rights in accordance with the provisions of the Agreement. In addition, Mr. Rochholz will have 206.9(a) rights to the Sacramento Gas Load Center. In the event Mr. Rochholz is required to relocate to a headquarters other than Marysville or Sacramento, which is beyond a commutable distance from his current residence, he will be further entitled to the provisions outlined in Pre-Review Committee Decision 1170 (attached).
- 6. The Relief Pressure Operators at the Sacramento Gas Load Center, when not relieving other Operators, will be utilized to provide office clerical assistance and to provide Field Metermen relief. However, Company intends that they will only be used for relief of the Field Metermen positions headquartered at the Sacramento Gas Load Center except in emergency or unusual conditions.

It is our understanding that this has been reviewed with Union Business Representatives Ed Fortier and Wayne Greer.
