This letter cancels and supersedes our letter dated April 17, 1981, (81-13-PGE) on the same subject.

In response to Pre-Review Committee Referral 555, the Apprenticeship Committee recommends the following:

An employee who has attended Basic Climbing School at Kettleman, but who either asked to be released prior to completion or completed the school and received a failing grade, shall be scheduled to attend the school one additional time, at the employee's request, provided that attendance is scheduled no sooner than 30 days nor later than 120 days following dismissal from school the first time.

An employee who desires to attend the school a second time must complete a Request Form to be supplied at the school and return it not later than 30 calendar days from the last day attended, to the employee's Division or General Construction Personnel Department.

An employee who fails to make a timely request, except in situations beyond the employee's control, will not be given further consideration under Title 205 or 305 to jobs which require climbing.

An employee who fails in a second attempt to successfully complete the school for any reason, except illness or injury, will not be given further consideration under Title 205 or 305 of the Physical Agreement for placement in any apprenticeship which requires climbing.
