The above-subject grievance has been discussed by the Pre-Review Committee prior to its docketing on the agenda of the Review Committee and is being returned. pursuant to Section IB(2) of the Review Committee procedure, to the Local Investigating Committee for settlement in accordance with the following:

This case involves an East Bay Division grievance alleging that it is improper to require System Operators to perform switching at an unattended substation.

In an effort to provide a basis for settlement for this case, the Company member of the Pre-Review Committee canvassed the system to determine the Company's general practice relating to the use of a System Operator to perform switching at unattended substations. The response from the Divisions was reviewed with the Union and indicated that, in almost every Division, System Operators are used to switch at unattended substations. Generally, however, the Divisions have indicated that other classifications are utilized first--these are, where they exist and are otherwise available for the assignment: Troublemen, Roving Operators, Utility Operators, and Relief System Operators, which is consistent with their job definitions. Under limited circumstances, Electricians and Electrical Technicians are also used. A simple, but not necessarily definitive, answer to the question raised in this grievance is that System Operators not only may be allowed to, but in fact do, perform switching at unattended substations. The Committee agrees, therefore, that the Operators and Troublemen share the switching assignments being grieved, as a "common duty,"

In reviewing the system practice, however, it is also apparent that, generally speaking, those classifications listed above who normally perform this kind of switching, when available, are assigned to such activities on a preferential basis before a System Operator is used. In reviewing these practices, the Pre-Review Committee is in agreement that such preferential right of assignment and/or call-out to perform such assignment be given those classifications listed above, when practical

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prior to using System Operators for this kind of work. When determining practicality, consideration must be given to availability, overtime vs. straight time, response time involved, and qualifications.

This case is considered closed on the basis of the foregoing, and the closure should be so noted by the Local Investigating Committee.
