DEAR MR. THOMPSON:

Union's MEMBERS OF THE REVIEW COMMITTEE WISH TO WITHDRAW R.C. FILE #154.

THE ISSUE OF DETERMINING NOW THE GRIEVANT'S QUALIFICATIONS FOR A JOB AWARDED OVER A VEAR AGO IS DIFFICULT, IF NOT IMPOSPIBLE. THE TRAINING AND BACK-GROUND FOR A HELPER IS GENERALLY NOT SUCH THAT IT WOULD QUALIFY HIM FOR A SENIOR WAREHOUSEMAN'S JOB. THIS PARTICULAR EMPLOYEE HAD NO PREVIOUS TRAINING WHICH WOULD INDICATE QUALIFICATIONS IN THIS LINE OF WORK. THEREFORE, WE FEEL THAT WITH NO BUBSTANTIVE ARGUMENTS BY THE UNION THAT THIS CASE SHOULD BE GLOSED.

ALTHOUGH THE UNION IS ASPEPTING THE COMPANY'S POSITION ON THIS PARTICULAR CAPE, UNION FEELS THAT CARES OF THIS NATURE SAQUED NOT BE BELAVED TO THE EXTENT THAT PROPER EVALUATION CANNOT BE MADE.

WE FEEL THAT THE JOINT REVIEW COMMITTEE SHOULD ISSUE A STATEMENT TO THE HUMBOLDT DIVISION GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE POINTING OUT THE DIFFIGULTIES OF DETERMINING AN 188 ME OF THIS KIND WHEN SO MUCH DELAY HAS OCCURRED. AND THAT THERE IS A JOINT RESPONSIBILITY TO SEE THAT PROPER REFERRAL OF SUCH CASES IS MADE.
