Gentlemen:

During the negotiations concluded July 31, 1959, it is our understanding that Company and Union agreed to modify the job definition of Apprentice Serviceman in the Gas Department to read as follows:

Apprentice Serviceman

An employee who assists Servicemen and employees in higher classifications in the Gas Service Department in performing gas service work. In addition he performs by himself the following duties:

Start: Routine operations such as domestic meter changes, locks and removals, change of party and incidental chart changes.

End six months: In addition to the foregoing, all duties of a Serviceman in connection with completing gas and electric meter sets and unlocks.

End eighteen months: As he becomes capable, performs all the duties of a Serviceman.

Upon completion of two years as an Apprentice Serviceman, an employee shall be reclassified to Serviceman.

The ratio of apprentices to journeymen in the Gas Service Department shall be not more than 1 to 5 on a Division basis, except where there are less than 5 journeymen in a Division or where it is necessary to train employees for specific anticipated vacancies.

If the foregoing is in accord with your understanding of our Agreement, please so indicate in the space provided below and return one executed copy of this letter to Company.
