CURRENT STATUS OF REVIEW CASE DRUM 741.5 JOINT POLE  
CLERK VACANCY, AUBURN ENGINEERING OFFICE. (Grievance  
No. 15-63-1)

In view of the age of the Grievance it was referred back to the local Division Committee on August 20, 1969 for further consideration and discussion.

It was decided at the Joint Grievance Committee meeting on Sept. 11, 1969 that the Personnel Manager P. Wilbur and Union Representative F. Anderson would investigate and report at the October meeting.

This was done. Early in October I checked with Mrs. C.C. Hastings Clerk C (exempt) in the Engineering office, Auburn along with several other employees. The only thing they could remember is that the Grievant Carl Epsley wanted the Clerk B job vacancy, (that of the Joint Pole Clerk) and he was the Steward. Following the filing and referral to review he retired. The Clerk C in exempt status was not a member and is not interested in any of this. I am interested in where these duties go whenever the Company takes the opportunity to down grade duties -- however I can find no one who will cooperate or give me anything to go on therefore I recommended at the October 9, 1969 Joint Grievance meeting that the case be dropped. All agreed.

I also reported all my findings at both preceding unit meetings along with my intentions of dropping the matter unless someone could come up with something to go on.
