These grievances involve the contractual rights of individuals to preferential treatment on job awards to veterans under Section 205.10. The individuals have, subsequent to the filing of these grievances, attained the job classifications sought by the grievance. Further, as a result of discussions involving this issue, Company and Union have established the scope of Section 205.10 by an agreed procedure for determining veteran's preference in the future.

With the attainment of the jobs sought by the grievants and their future rights under the Contract now clearly established, no further purpose could be gained by answering these grievances. We therefore are withdrawing these grievances from Review and will consider them closed. Our action shall in no way be construed to deny the individual any rights he may have which are in excess of our Contract and shall not prejudice further action by the individual aside from the grievance procedure.
