

The above subject grievance concerning the assignment of hours to certain Helpers in the San Francisco Gas Meter Shop is herewith returned by the Review Committee for further deliberation with a view towards settlement by the Division Joint Grievance Committee. The only issue considered by the Review Committee concerned the timeliness of the filing of the grievance. In referring the grievance back to your Committee, the Review Committee does so with the following agreed understanding:

1. The grievances of J. Naron and A. Bates were not filed within the time limits prescribed in Section 102.6. In view of the circumstances leading to the late filing of their formal grievances, however, it is the decision of the Review Committee that their grievances will be considered, and resolved, if possible, by the Division Joint Grievance Committee. If not resolved by that Committee, they may be referred to Review by the Union if they so desire. It is understood, however, that if the Review Committee is unable to mutually resolve the grievances, they may not be referred to arbitration.
2. The grievance of P. Anduza is subject to the provisions of Title 102, and should therefore be considered in accordance with the procedure set forth in that Title.
