Dear Mr. Thompson:

As a result of discussions relating to R. C. #612, it is the belief of Union that a rate should be established for the mobile crane, Unit Coles, which is used as a system-wide piece of equipment in the Hydro areas. The use of the mechanic rate for this equipment does not seem appropriate in view of the type of equipment and the purposes for which it is used. We believe with the similarity of the equipment to the crane at the Davis Yard and the fact that the capacity is over twice that of the Davis crane, the scale should be no less than this rate. We are therefore proposing that we establish a job classification of Crane Operator for the operation of the boom part of the rig and suggest the job definition and wage rate be the same as that at the Davis Yard. The wage rate would be:

Gentlemen:

In response to your letter of June 23 and subsequent discussions on the subject, Company proposes to establish the classification of Crane Operator in the Electric Maintenance Department, with the following job definition and wage rate:

Crane Operator (To be used on a temporary basis only.)

An employee who operates a mobile crane of 25 tons' capacity or more, used in the operating, maintaining and constructing of hydro plants, substations or other facilities.

Wage Rate - \$146.60 per week

The above single rate, which is the 30-month step of the apprentice classification, is proposed since it is doubtful that any employee will spend more than a cumulative total of six months operating the crane involved.

If you are in accord with the foregoing proposal and agree thereto, please so indicate in the space provided below and return one executed copy of this letter to Company.

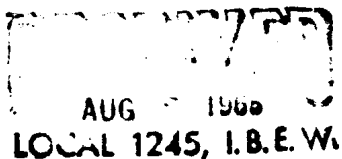

10-64-15 - William Edmonds - As of July 22, 1965 Edmonds had not yet been paid - I am advised that Company requested Edmonds to make out new time cards covering the days and time in question in the grievance and that Edmonds had refused to make out such cards until he received notice from the Union as to what settlement had been agreed to, and that Company was holding up the payoff until new cards are made up. The steward in the headquarters was made aware of the settlement agreed to and will advise Edmonds -- how much longer it will take to get the payoff made, and whether Edmonds will or will not make out new cards to replace those previously turned in I don't know - since settlement of the grievance Edmonds has been awarded a job in the Drum division and is leaving De Sabla so I will be out of touch with him from here on.
