Subject of the Grievance

These cases all involve the assignment of Shut-Off for Non-Payment of Three Phase Meters to Metering Systems Technicians.

Facts of the Case

In December 2003 Company met with Union to outline its plan to reassign certain customer related work assignments from various classifications to other lower paid classifications. These reassignments would occur where the duties were common to one or more of the classifications involved in the transfer of the work. Of the transitioned duties, only the SONP of 3-phase meters to the Metering Technicians was grieved on behalf of the Troublemen.

The above duties have historically been performed by Troublemen throughout the system. However, Company was able to demonstrate that Metering Technicians have also performed these duties since the implementation of the FAS system in late 2002 and early 2003. In addition, Company provided 1997 resumes from the Metering Technician 94-53 Committee. The resumes indicate that a joint committee recommended these duties transition to Metering Technicians and that the Job Definitions sub-committee make the appropriate change to the Metering Technician job definition; however, this did not occur before the 94-53 Committees were disbanded.

Discussion

Union noted that Metering Technicians are higher paid than Troublemen and assigning SONP's to the Metering Technicians didn't fit the stated reason for the change. Union pointed to the statements of various Metering Technicians that they've never performed these duties. Finally, Union stated the negotiated job definition for Metering Technicians does not include any language to support this assignment, while the Troubleman job definition does.

Company responded that the reason for the transfer of these duties is so that the Troublemen can be more fully utilized on restoration and maintenance of the electrical system; and that Metering Technicians have the ability, skill, knowledge, and tools to shut off 3-phase meters. They do it anyway for their own work.

The finding and review of the 94-53 committee resumes at the Review Committee step of the grievance procedure set the stage for resolving these grievances.

Decision

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Company and Union agree that SONP (shut-off for non-payment) of 3-phase meters is a duty common to Troublemen and Metering Systems Technicians. Company, in its exlusive discretion, will make work assignments to either classification giving consideration to operational need and availability of resources.

Further, the parties agree to the following language similar to what was agreed in the 2000 General Negotiations in effecting changes in the Job Definitions and Lines of Progression:

No current Troublemen will be displaced as a result of this agreement. Incumbent Troublemen will maintain their wage and classification, unless they voluntarily vacate their position. Both parties recognize that there may be other conditions outside of this agreement that independently may affect the number of Troublemen. If conditions outside this agreement would result in reductions in a headquarters, the parties agree to meet and discuss the following: (1) the impact on this agreement, (2) moving the work back to the Troublemen.

For the record, attached (not for distribution) is a list of current regular Troublemen in the system.

On the basis of the foregoing, this case is closed without adjustment.
