An employee who is a Working Foreman in charge of a crew and equipment engaged in such work as installing non-lead covered underground cables, maintaining manholes, installing hand holes and underground boxes, digging holes or excavations, stubbing poles, clearing rights-of-way, clearing debris, loading, delivering and unloading material and supplies and Street Light Maintenanceman duties. May be required to drive the truck and operate the associated equipment. Must be familiar with the Company's safety and other applicable rules and procedures. An employee's crew may include a driver (e.g. T&D Assistant) and one Lineman, Apprentice Lineman, Cable Splicer or Apprentice Cable Splicer.

May be assigned to work on overhead and underground equipment 0 - 600 volt, including splicing.

Shall have the personal qualifications of leadership and supervisory ability and a background of experience in the Electric Transmission and Distribution Department.

Shall have a Class A Driver's license and may operate an aerial lift.
