Gentlemen:

In our letter of August 26, 1954 outlining the agreement reached August 13, 1954 we stated that the job definitions of the Service Operator, First, and the Warehouseman classifications would be revised to include the duties of Service Operator, Junior, and Storekeeper "C" respectively.

It is our reconsidered opinion that no change need be made in the definition of the Service Operator, First, classification. Company, therefore, proposes to abolish the job definitions of the Service Operator, Junior, and Storekeeper "C" classifications and to amend the definition of the Warehouseman classification to read as follows:

Warehouseman

An employee who is qualified to perform without direct supervision, and is engaged in performing, subordinate to the Storekeeper, the routine duties in a class A or B substore or who is in charge of, and engaged in handling all of the work and duties relating to the operation of a class C substore.

If you are in accord with the foregoing and agree thereto, please so indicate in the space provided below and return one copy of this letter to Company.
