Pursuant to our understanding of the decision reached at the meeting of the Review Committee on Tuesday, December 16, 1952, we propose for your written acceptance the following described wage practices which have heretofore been in operation:

WAGE RATE FOR TRUCK DRIVER CLASSIFICATION

The wage rates for Truck Drivers - Light, General Construction Department, appear as follows in the schedule of wage rates attached to the agreement of September 1, 1952:

Driver, Truck	<u>Minimum Maximum</u>	
Light - two tons or less	Per Week	
Flat Rack	(Range) \$69.68 \$77.38	
Light - with power winch and rigging	(Range) \$80.1 9 \$ 85.43	

The range from \$80.19 to \$85.43 shall apply for rigging operations requiring the use of one or more blocks, but when operations require a direct pull with the use of the winch the range of \$69.38 to \$77.38 shall

WAGE RATE FOR PIPE WRAPPER CLASSIFICATION

The wage rate for Pipe Wrappers, General Construction Department, appear as follows in the schedule of wage rates attached to the

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agreement of September 1, 1952:

Pipe Wrapper	-	Hand	(Range)	\$73.14	\$87.16	

The rate of \$87.16 shall apply for wrapping pipe over 6" in diameter, nominal size. The range from \$73.14 to \$79.85 shall apply for wrapping pipe 6" in diameter, nominal size, and below, except, however, that if any individual employee is now receiving in excess of \$79.85 for wrapping pipe 6" in diameter or below he shall continue to receive such rate therefor.

INCREASES WITHIN A WAGE RANGE

Section 304.1 of the agreement of September 1, 1952 shall be interpreted to require that an employee shall be given an increase in the amount and at the interval therein described, but that if the Company does not grant an employee a wage increase in accordance therewith it shall notify the employee and state its reasons therefor.

DUAL RATES

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In lieu of the use of regularly assigned dual classifications in the General Construction Department, employees in such department may be upgraded to temporary classifications upon time card approval, thereby removing the previously existing impediment to temporary promotions of qualified employees on a seniority basis.
