Dear Mr. Dalzell:

Nuclear Operators (NO) enrolled in the Initial Operator Training Course (IOTC) at Diablo Canyon Power Plant (DCPP) are typically assigned an eight hour per day, Monday through Friday work schedule (5 x 8) during classroom instruction. However, in weeks that have a single holiday during the week (i.e. Veterans Day, Martin Luther King Day, New Year's Day, etc.), the Company may shift employee schedules to a ten hour schedule (4 x 10), with the Company-observed holiday becoming the employee's Regular Day Off (RDO). Many employees in the IOTC program do not earn holiday pay, so this change provides an opportunity for these employees to receive a full forty-hour work week while helping the IOTC program stay on schedule. Employees who are eligible for paid holidays will have the holiday hours credited to their Holiday-In-Lieu (HIL) bank.

The parties recognize that these schedule changes are mutually-beneficial, so employees will not be entitled to additional compensation when changing to a ten hour holiday schedule (4 x 10) or when reverting back to the standard eight hour schedule (5 x 8).
