Gentlemen:

In order to provide the employees who man the "Pony Express" service with a three-day holiday over the upcoming Washington's Birthday holiday, the Company proposes to consider Sunday, February 15, 1976, which is the first day of the basic workweek of the employees involved, as Washington's Birthday holiday and to permit them to take that day off with pay. The work hours of February 16, 1976, will be considered as a regular work day, and no overtime will be payable for the regular work hours of that day. This will permit the employees to have Friday, Saturday, and Sunday off, which gives them a three-day weekend without loss of pay.
