Gentlemen:

A question has been raised concerning the appropriate wage step of an appointee to an Apprentice Lineman classification vacancy in Redwood City. The employee, Mr. Anthony Espinoza, is a T & D Driver in Santa Cruz.

Resolution of the question involves the principles agreed upon by Company and Union on April 21, 1967 relating to the wage rates of employees entering apprentice classifications. Specifically, the question narrows to whether he was "regularly assigned" as a T & D Driver on or before December 10, 1966. In our opinion, the facts of this case indicate that the employee should be placed in the apprentice classification at his present wage rate as a T & D Driver. These facts, briefly, are that even though the employee was delayed in commencing work as a T & D Driver, he had substantially met the requirements of Item 1 of the letter of agreement when he completed his final day as a Warehouseman at the close of work hours, Friday, December 9, 1966. We believe these factors override the strict application of the letter of agreement that as he did not commence work as a T & D Driver until Monday, December 12, a different wage application should follow.

If you are in accord with the foregoing proposal and agree thereto, please so indicate in the space provided below and return one executed copy of this letter to Company.
