Gentlemen:

This will supplement our letter of agreement, dated June 7, 1968, relative to the use of the Utility Aide in the 1968 summer work experience program.

Company proposes to employ five inexperienced persons at Moss Landing Power Plant from July 8 through August 30, 1968, at \$1.75 per hour, or \$70.00 per week. These employees will be under the supervision of a journeyman machinist temporarily upgraded to mechanical foreman and will be assigned to cleanup duties following the major construction at Moss Landing.

The specific duties will include such things as: weeding the area between the Plant and the 115 KV and 230 KV switchyards; general cleanup of all levels of boilers, 1 through 8, particularly ground floor; cleaning and polishing the turbine room deck, all units; cleaning up construction debris from all levels around boilers on units 6 and 7; lifting floor plates and cleaning trenches, all units; dusting off piping, heaters and idle machinery; weeding and cleaning around intake structures; cleaning boiler fronts on boilers 1 through 8; cleaning water softener room; cleaning up growth around perimeter fence; and, cleaning the areas around and under bearing cooling water and hydrogen cooling water pumps.
