Gentlemen:

The Lines of Progression and Job Definitions for Pipe Line Operations provide no bidding consideration under the provisions of Subsection 205.7(b) to an employee in the classification of Routine Gas Control Mechanic.

Company proposes to allow such an employee to bid under Subsection 205.7(b) on vacancies which occur in the Gas Control Mechanic classification; however, after one opportunity to change headquarters as a result of being the successful bidder under Subsection 205.7(b), such bidding status will no longer be available to the employee. If he is the successful bidder to fill a Gas Control Mechanic vacancy at another location, he shall be continued as a Routine Gas Control Mechanic until the requirements are met for promotion to regular Gas Control Mechanic.

Company also proposes that for the purposes of Title 206, a vacancy in the classification of Gas Control Mechanic shall be considered as a vacancy in the Routine Gas Control Mechanic classification for purposes of determining an election available to an employee classified as a Routine Gas Control Mechanic who is to be displaced due to lack of work.

If you are in accord with the foregoing proposals and agree thereto, please so indicate in the space provided below and return one executed copy of this letter to Company.
