It is my understanding of our discussion on May 18, 1953, that we are in accord that the present negotiations on a new agreement covering clerical and office employees include all the amendments either party proposes to offer for the time being. It is also our understanding that neither party intends to submit further proposed amendments under Section 2 of Article XIX of the clerical Agreement dated August 1, 1947.

We understand that the new clerical agreement will have to be submitted to the Union membership for ratification before it can be executed. It is therefore possible that some changes may have to be made in the most recent draft of the proposed agreement. In order that further modification in the proposed new agreement will not be foreclosed by failure to give notice of amendment under said Section 2, we propose that this letter, when signed by you, will constitute notice of amendment by each party to the other under said Section 2, such notice being for the purpose of permitting further negotiation, if necessary, on the amendments heretofore proposed.

If the foregoing correctly interprets your understanding and you agree thereto, will you please so indicate on the duplicate original of this letter?
