Gentlemen:

In a letter dated February 4, 1953, Company proposed to change the classification of Mr. Ivan L. Wilson, employed in Monterey, from Appliance Repairman to Utilityman at \$82.29 per week (which would be \$85.20 at current rates) to correspond with the work he is now performing. At that time, you objected to the use of the classification of Electric Serviceman in the make-up of the Utilityman classification. Since that time, there has been a failure to agree on a wage rate and the proper make-up of this classification.

In order to close this matter, Company now proposes to establish the classification of Combinationman at \$85.50 per week. All operating duties will be assigned to the Utilityman (Monterey Sub) classification, all clerical and dispatching duties to the Service Operator classification and all service duties to the Serviceman classification. The breakdown of the remaining duties will be as follows:

Utilityman (Monterey Sub)	20%	of \$80.95	or	\$16.19
Service Operator	40%	of \$85.25	or	\$34.10
Serviceman	40%	of \$87.95	or	\$35.18
Combinationman	100%			\$85.47
