Gentlemen:

The Review Committee, in recent months, has discussed the matter of Helpers accruing classification seniority acquired in a different line of progression. The issue was specifically presented in Review Committee Case No. 225 when a Helper in the Gas Transmission and Distribution Department alleged that he should have added to such classification seniority the time previously spent as a Helper in the Electric Maintenance Department.

The purpose then of the following proposal is to provide a uniform understanding as to the status of employees in beginning classifications in going from one line of progression to another in a beginner's classification.

In the event that Company appoints to such job an employee in a beginner's classification from another line of progression, such employee shall retain his present rate of pay, and classification seniority for the purpose of further wage rate progressions, not to exceed the top rate established for the beginner's classification in the new line of progression. Such employee shall not, however, be entitled to consideration under the provisions of Section 205.7(b) until such time as he has accrued six months' classification seniority in the new line of progrestion; thereafter, he shall be credited with all classification seniority acquired in a beginner's classification in other lines of progression up to a maximum of six (6) months, as well as all classification seniority acquired in the beginner's classification in the present line of progression.
