Gentlemen:

There are at present six pump crews, composed of two Helpers each, in the Electric Underground Department of San Francisco Division. The duties of these crews include minor maintenance and the pumping of manholes.

One man on each crew drives the truck and is responsible for the work performed. Company proposes to establish the classification of Manhole Pumpman at a weekly wage rate of \$74.00 per week for such employee.

The proposed definition for this classification is as follows:

Manhole Pumpman

An employee engaged in the cleaning of manholes and vaults. Drives truck, operates pump, inspects manholes for leaks and reports conditions found. May make minor or temporary repairs. Will accrue seniority as underground Helper for the purpose of bidding to Cartman.
