Mr. Robert E. Fowler, Ditch Patrolman in Sacramento Division, sustained an industrial injury to his lumbar spine on September 17, 1975. Several rehabilitation plans have been tried unsuccessfully including the placement of Mr. Fowler into a clerical position. Upon the advice of his physician, Company proposes to establish a Utility Groundman position in Belmont Service Center, San Jose Division, for Mr. Fowler.

Mr. Fowler formerly worked at Belmont and would report to the Electric General Foreman in Belmont. He would assist in loading and unloading of materials and delivering to job sites, assist in the maintenance and order of tools for the Belmont Electric T&D Department, and perform miscellaneous yard work. He would be paid at the top of the Groundman wage rate, with the understanding that he would not have bidding rights in the Electric T&D line of progression without further negotiations.
