#### Gentlemen:

On February 10, 1976, Mr. J. M. Rippee, Lineman, Oakhurst, San Joaquin Division, suffered an industrial back injury. On March 31, 1978, Mr. Rippee's condition was found to be permanent, stationary and rateable and he was permanently precluded from working in the Lineman classification. Mr. Rippee has been functioning in a light duty capacity since 1977.

In the course of his light duty assignments, Mr. Rippee has successfully performed a variety of activities, as represented by the attached listing of job duties. Therefore, pursuant to Section 204.4 of the Physical Agreement, Company proposes to establish a position for Mr. Rippee that will incorporate these duties. The position will be a Utility Lineman (Present Incument Only), Oakhurst, with a weekly wage rate of \$535.05. The wage rate of the position is computed by multiplying the percent of time spent in the attached named duties by the wage rate established for the corresponding classification.
