I'm writing this letter , in order to formalize the request I made to you during our conversation at Kettle--man Pump Station. Due to hardship, both financial and emotional , I formally request transfer to Santa Margarita , Calif. Due to my unusual circumstances, it is very difficult to maintain myself on the road , as would be normal for a communication technician. My financial position has been ver, seriously harmed by large doctor bills , due to my sons oroken neck. At present he is in the Kaiser Permenante dospital in Vallejo , and has recently gone into rehabili--tation , and although covered by two hospital plans, there remains some \$ 300.00 per month not covered, in addition , the cost of traveling to Vallejo and return has resulted in in heavy additional expenses leaving me almost flat broke.

I think that I mentioned the emotional problem with my wife, she has only recently been able to get into Cal. Poly, and with only a year to go before graduation, is determined not to move, she says that she is going to stay even if I am forced to sell my mobile home, and that if it comes to that she will seperate. I sincerly hope that you can understand my position and anxiety in wishing to return to my former position at Santa Margarita. In talking with my union business agent, he said that I should mention section 301.16 (I hope that, that is the correct one) when writing to you.

I sincerly enjoyed talking with you have , & I do wish that I had done it before all the big mess occurred , I value the rapport we catablished.
