Dear Mr. Clark,

I was displaced from Woodland (Yolo District) to Sacramento on April 14, 1986 as a result of a grievance that was filed to fill an equipment operator position. The company filled the position by reclassifying my gas helper position to an equipment operator position.

On April 1, 1986 my wife and I found out that she was carrying quadruplets and that it was going to be a very high risk pregnancy. She will be hospitalized at least two months before the delivery of the children. There is a high probability that she could go into labor before this time, resulting in her being put in the hospital. At this time my wife is at home and the doctor has ordered complete bed rest. This has resulted in my having to take over complete household duties including the care of our 4 year old son. I have come across a problem of finding a babysitter that will take my son at 5:30 1.M. so that I will have enough time to drive to Sacramento to be at work by 7:00 A.M.

Ideally, I would like to be transferred to Woodland, a 20 minute drive from my home, under a hardship transfer 205.17. I would like this transfer because raising 4 infants at one time will be a hardship for quite some time.

I have explained my situation to my construction supervisor, Dave Burke, in Woodland prior to my displacement but received no response. In Sacramento I brought the situation to the attention of my general foreman, Ed Gay. I was contacted soon thereafter by Mr. Gay to attend a meeting with Gary Stone, Yolo District Manager, Dave Burke, and Keith Gockel, acting Gas Superintendant of Yolo District regarding my hardship. At the end of this meeting, Mr. Gockel told me he would get with me the next week and let me know what they had decided. I have waited about 1 month and have still not received a decision. My time is running out.

Upon discussing the situation with my father-in-law, Dick Snell, retired Division Gas Engineer in Sacramento, he suggested that I contact you.

I would appreciate anything you could do to help me through this hardship.
