## Gentlemen:

In 1987, the Reprographics Section of the General Office installed a computerized business management system (PRIMAC) requiring the entry of data for every job received in the shop at the time of receipt and additional data at the time of completion for the purpose of tracking and scheduling. Delays would occur in the shop when data was not entered on time. This would happen because the incumbent clerks responsible for dealing with the customers at the counter did not possess the necessary skill to facilitate speedy processing of data. In order to prevent backlog, two clerks were borrowed from Data Recording to assist in the data entry tasks. The PRIMAC system is presently being replaced with a new computer system which will require even more data entry time.

The three clerks in Reprographics are slowly adapting to the new system; however, it is desireable that future incumbents be Utility Clerk-Typists.

Company proposes, pursuant to Section 13.5, to reclassify the three Utility Clerk positions to Utility Clerk-Typist, with the current incumbents remaining in place. Company agrees to fill the next two vacancies under the provisions of Subsection 18.5(c).
