Gentlemen:

Pursuant to Meter Reader Agreement dated September 1988 (exhibit C) Company proposes to exercise the option stated in item E#6 with regard to "Route String Bidding" procedures as it effects item E#4 of the same agreement. The changes would be for the Stockton Headquarters only. Specifically it is proposed to reschedule the bidding and assignment procedures of "Route Strings Bidding" from May of each year (effective in June) until the week prior to the first Monday in October of each year (effective the first Monday in October).

This rescheduling will result in the reduction of non-productive time incurred by meter readers newly assigned to routes in conjunction with remotely located agricultural accounts during peak irrigating periods. Route familiarization will then occur during off-peak irrigation seasons when revenues will be least impacted by "missed meter" situations.

CANCELLATION

Either the Company or Union reserves the right to return to the original terms of the 1988 agreement with 30 days written notice.
