Gentlemen:

Recent determinations by the CPUC have increased the volume of notices to be delivered by the Customer Services Department. In addition, fluctuations in the volume of gas service work have created occasional periods in which Gas Service personnel are available to perform additional work.

To assist both Departments, Company proposes, pursuant to Section 204.4 of the Physical Agreement, to allow Gas Servicemen and Reserve Gas Servicemen in East Bay Division to deliver 48-hour notices to residential customers with the following stipulations:

- Regular gas service work will take precedence. The delivery of 48-hour notices will be "as time permits."
- The utilization of Gas Service personnel to deliver 48-hour notices will not reduce the present complement of Credit Representatives.
- Gas Service personnel delivering 48-hour notices will be allowed to accept payments but not solicit payments or make credit arrangements.
- Reserve Gas Servicemen delivering 48-hour notices will be paid at the Gas Servicemen rate.

This Agreement will be in effect through December 31, 1983. In mid-year 1983, Company and Union will meet to review the status of workload with the Gas Utilization Department.
