

## LABOR AGREEMENT INTERPRETATION

SUBJECT: Additional Sick Leave Allowance

TITLE 209 - SICK LEAVE - Physical Agreement TITLE 7 - SICK LEAVE - Clerical Agreement

Sections 209.3B and 7.3B

An employee must first perform services during a calendar year before current or additional sick leave will be allowed; except that

- 1. An employee who is using current or accumulated sick leave on the last work day of any calendar year, and whose absence by reason of sickness continues and extends into the next following year, shall, after exhausting his accumulated sick leave, be allowed additional sick leave in accordance with the formula in the Sections cited above if he qualifies therefor in such following calendar year.
- 2. An employee who is using additional sick leave on the last work day of any calendar year, and whose absence by reason of sickness continues and extends into the next following year, shall be allowed furthur additional sick leave, in accordance with the formula in the Sections cited above if he qualifies therefor in such following calendar year. Such additional sick leave shall be allowed effective the first work day of such following calendar year that an employee is absent by reason of sickness.



## EXAMPLE-A

EMPLOYEE OFF ON ACCUMULATED SICK LEAVE AT END OF YEAR. QUALIFIES FOR ADDITIONAL SICK LEAVE.



Employee with more than 10 years service, is absent due to sickness, communicing 11-1-62

Has 50 days Accumulated Sick Leave due in 1962.

Is allowed these 50 days, bringing him up to 1-16-63, plus 10 days Accumulated from 1962, extending him up to 1-30-63.

A review of his sick leave usage for the 8 years, 1955-1962 inclusive, indicates that he qualifies for 20 days Additional Sick Leave in 1963 under the applicable formula.

He is allowed these 20 days, extending him up to 2-28-63, when he goes on leave of absence

He physically returns to work on 7-1-63, thereupon qualifying for Current Annual 1963 sick leave

His return is back-dated 10 work days, to 6-17-63, to pick up these 10 days Current Annual Sick Leave for which he qualified upon his return to active employment

after the expiration of his Additional Sick Leave in 1963. Same general situation as Example A, except that instead of returning in June-July, employee returns in March, 3 days


Upon returning on 3-5-63 his return is back-dated to pick up 10 days Curr at Annual 1963 Sick Leave for which he qualifies upon his return to the payroll.

Sick Leave. Seven of these days of Current Sick Leave overlap a like number of days (7) for which he was previously paid Additional

The full 10 days Current Annual 1963 Sick Leave will be charged, and his Additional Sick Leave credited with 7 days.

Later that same year, he is again off due to illness, when he will receive the balance from his Additional Sick Leave (7 days) after which he will go on leave of absence to 12-1-63, when he returns.

Upon qualifying for Current Annual Sick Leave when he returns to work on 2-21-63, he is allowed 3 days of such Current Sick Leave, back to, but not overlapping the date on which his Accumulated Sick Leave was used up.


He is off again 5 days due to sickness in August 1963, using up 5 days (3 in February, 5 in August) for a total of 8 days Current Sick Leave used in 1963.

He loses no more time in 1963, and Accumulates 2 days of sick leave for the year.

OF YEAR.




Annual Sick Leave in 1961). Employee is sick commencing 12-21-62. Has no Accumulated Sick Leave due. (Used it all in 1961, plus his 10 days Current

He accumulates 4 days unused sick leave from 1962. Has used no sick leave so far in 1962. Is allowed 6 days Current Annual 1962 Sick Leave, from 12-21 to 12-31-62 inclusive.

These 4 days are paid to him on January 2, 3, 4, 7, 1963 at which time his sick leave usage is reviewed in 1955-62 inclusive, and he is found to qualify for Additional Sick Leave. He is then allowed 20 days Additional Sick Leave to cover the period 1-8-63 to 2-5-63, when he goes on Leave of Absence.

Upon his return to the payroll on 7-1-63, his return is back-dated 10 work days to 6-17-63, to pick up Current Annual 1963 Sick Leave.

An employee is off sick commencing 10-1-62.

He is allowed all Accumulated Sick Leave due, ending 12-2-62.

He is allowed 10 days Current Annual 1962 Sick Leave, for the period 12-3-(2 to 12-14-62 inclusive

He is paid 10 days of this Additional Sick Leave, from 12-17-62 to 12-31-62 inclusive.

Employee with less than 10 years service is absent due to sickness, commencing 11-1-62.

Has 50 days Accumulated Sick Leave due in 1962.

Is allowed these 50 days, bringing him up to 1-16-43, plus 10 days Accumula ed Sick Leave from 1962, extending his time with pay to 1-30-63.


Has no further sick leave due, because he does not qualify for Additional Sick Leave. Goes on Leave of Absence

Physically returns to work on 7-1-63, thereupon qualifying for Current Annual 1963 Sick Leave

His return is back-dated 10 work days, to 6-17-63, to pick up these 10 days Current Annual 1963 Sick Leave which he qualified for upon his return to active employment.
