DEPARTMENT HEADS DISTRICT MANAGER SAN FRANCISCO DIVISION

My August 10, 1981 letter outlined a "Formal Inspection Program" of Company vehicles.

The Electric Department started inspecting their 236 vehicles in September and October. Following each initial inspection, the responsible party was notified of an unsecured vehicle (doors and/or compartments).

Four (4) subsequent inspections have been conducted with the following results:

- 1. Forty-four (44) vehicles were found on one occasion with unlocked doors and/or compartments.
- 2. Six (6) vehicles were found on two separate occasions with the same infractions.
- 3. One (1) vehicle was found on three separate occasions with the same infractions.
- 4. In January, eleven (11) vehicles were improperly secured; there was only one (1) repeater the three timer listed under Item 3.

It has been demonstrated that "Security" improved when we worked at it. Consequently, an "Inspection Program" will continue. However, it does not appear that any formal action need be taken until one individual is responsible for a number of breaches of vehicle security, i.e. unlocked vehicle doors and/or compartments, without mitigating circumstances.





A present, past and future "<u>Citation</u>" will only constitute notice of the infraction noted and <u>recorded</u>. Appropriate discipline will follow only where a pattern of infractions has been established during a reasonable period of time.
