## Subject of the Grievance:

A urine sample collection procedure violated the confidentiality and dignity of the Grievant when the sample taken at the job site in the "blue room" was split on the hood of a car in view of the crew and the public.

Company will do all it can to assure that employees are accorded privacy and respect during this procedure.
