## Subject of the Grievance

This case concerns a work jurisdiction dispute between Electric Meter Technicians and either contractors or exempt employees.

## Facts of the Case

The work involves meeting with customers to conduct a pre-inspection of their facilities to make recommendations for the installation of load research meters. There is testimony in the LIC report that there has been a long standing practice of assigning the initial contact to exempt employees who then turn over a list of approved locations to the Meter Techs. There is also testimony that there are times when these inspections are assigned to the bargaining unit, both Title 200 and Title 300 classifications. Further, there are examples of the Meter Techs going to a site even after its been inspected by an exempt or contractor.

Letter Agreement-94-34 establishes the job definition and line of progression for Electric Metering Systems Technicians. It states in relevant part, "Pre-approves meter/service plans and insects facilities and installations for compliance with Company Standards and Governmental Regulations."

## **Decision**

The PRC agreed that the past practice established the pre-inspection work as a shared responsibility with two distinct interests. The Meter Tech is solely responsible to inspect facilities and installations for compliance with company Standards and Governmental Regulations. The Marketing Department needs to conduct pre-inspections to recruit customers.

Based on the facts in the LIC report, the PRC agrees that no violation of the agreement occurred. This case is closed without adjustment.
