

Subject of the Grievance

This case alleges a 212 emergency overtime bypass.

Facts of the Case

Late in the afternoon of December 29, 2003 a pad mount booster bank located in Cameron Park blew due to overload, leaving 142 customers without power. Because, this same booster bank had to be replaced 18 months prior, it was decided to replace it with a larger booster bank. One was located in Fresno on December 30. At that point, arrangements were made with GC for a crew to install. The GC crew arrived at the job site from Vacaville at approximately 3:00 p.m. The booster bank arrived about 4 p.m. A Division crew was on site about 2:00 p.m. to install the grounds before GC began their work. The Division crew went home at their normal 3:30 p.m. time.

The GC crew worked extension of the day overtime, completing the job about 1:00 a.m. on December 31, 2003.


Discussion

Union argued a Placerville Division crew should have been used for the overtime assignment as this was their work and the supervisor knew the job was going to go into overtime.

Company responded that the assignment was actually made to GC in the morning because they had the greater expertise for this job and the Division crews were already assigned to committed work. Further, there was no 212 call-out and therefore, no entitlement to bypass pay. Finally, Cameron Park is in the Sacramento service area not Placerville's.

Decision


The PRC agrees that no violation of the Agreement occurred. This case is closed without adjustment.
