Subject of the Grievance

This case concerns whether a Corrosion Mechanic was improperly bypassed for an M&C Coordinator - Gas vacancy.

Facts of the Case

The Company filled an M&C Coordinator-Gas vacancy in San Jose. The grievant is a Corrosion Mechanic which makes him a priority D bidder. There were no priority A, B, or C bidders interested in the vacancy. Three of the priority D bidders, including the grievant, were interviewed. The vacancy was offered to an employee who had less seniority than the grievant.

Discussion

The Union argued that the grievant should have been awarded the job as he was the most senior and The grievant previously held Fitter and Gas Crew Leader positions. most qualified D bidder. Employees in these classifications are considered as B or C bidders.

The Company responded that Letter Agreement 10-15 provides contractual bidding rights to M&C Coordinator vacancies only to priority A, B, and C bidders. In accordance with the letter agreement, "upon exhaustion of all confirmed priority A, B, and C bidders, as in accordance with the Agreement, the Company shall retain right to identify and interview candidates possibly including those listed as D or E bidders, RTW, or external candidates at Company discretion".

Decision

The Committee agrees there was no violation as the grievant was a D bidder and Letter Agreement 10-15 provides that once A, B, and C bidders are exhausted, an M&C Coordinator may be filled at the Company's discretion. This case is closed without adjustment.
