The question of the time element which would require a transfer to be effected after a bid is made, is clouded in R. C. #566 due to the type of dispute which existed over the right of these grievants to the jobs on which they had submitted bids and the fact that there was some question, at least on the part of one of the grievants, that he would accept the transfer after it was decided that his bid should be honored. Because of these factors, it is Union's belief that if this matter is to be resolved through the grievance procedure, it must be done through a case which does not involve residual matters which could affect the outcome of a decision on this specific issue.

We are therefore withdrawing R. C. #566 from the file without prejudice but will consider this particular case closed.
