Discussions on R. C. #613 regarding Company practice on using Troublemen for radio and television interference complaints, brought out that Troublemen are only used for first contact and routine checking for possible sourcessof interference. The use of a special Troublemen to do this work is not contemplated for the future and has not been the practice in the past. Except for minor repairs to eliminate interference, the Troublemen are limited to locating sources of trouble and the complaint is then referred to the maintenance crows for correction and elimination of the problem.

It was further stated that Troublemon use only a small portable radio for detection of sources and when a source is not readily located by this means, or when complicated detection devices are to be used, this work is then performed by a Communication Technician.

With the understanding that the above limits on Troublemen are correct and a further understanding that the use of supervisory employees to perform this work is not contemplated, Union is withdrawing R. C. #613 from the file and will consider the matter closed.
