Bypass of Employees to T&D Driver Vacancies Because They Did Not Possess California State Class I Driver's Licenses

MR. C. A. MILLER, Chairman San Francisco Division Joint Grievance Committee

Attached is a Review Committee Decision which has been agreed upon between Company and Local 1245, I.B.E.W., with respect to Review Committee File Nos. 1031 and 1268.

Basically, the Decision upholds the Division's position that a California State Class I Driver's License is a bona fide requirement of the T&D Driver classification. It should be pointed out that in future job awards to this classification, the successful bidder must have obtained a Class I Driver's License prior to being awarded the job. As to those T&D Drivers who are unable to obtain a Class I Driver's License and will then be subject for demotion as provided for in the Decision, the Division should notify the Review Committee of the circumstances involved prior to the actual demotion.

REVIEW COMMITTEE DECISION

Review Committee File Nos. 1031 and 1268
San Francisco Division Grievance Nos. D.Gr/C 2-70-16
and D.Gr/C 2-73-9

Statement of Facts

Both of these grievances involve the bypass of employees to T&D Driver vacancies because they did not possess California State Class I Driver's Licenses. A Class I License is required for towing a loaded cargo trailer weighing over 6,000 gross pounds.

State of the Issue

The unresolved issue in these grievances comes down to this question:

Is the possession of a Class I Driver's License a prerequisite to appointment to the T&D Driver classification?

The Union argues at the local level that the possession of a Class I License was never intended as a prerequisite for appointment to the classification either on a temporary or permanent basis inasmuch as the requirement is not spelled out in the T&D Driver Job Description. The Union further argues that the Divisions have been inconsistent in their application of this requirement.

Discussion

Before the Review Committee could resolve the grievances, it was necessary to ascertain when and how often a T&D Driver would be required to possess a Class I Driver's License during the normal operation of a line truck and cargo trailer. After considerable discussion, it is the finding of the Review Committee that system-wide Class I Licenses are routinely required, for example, situations when loaded cargo trailers exceeds 6,000 pounds gross weight.

After considering several alternatives and in order to reach a settlement in these cases, the Review Committee agrees that the answer to the problem and the grievances must come from the negotiated Job Description of the T&D Driver classification which reads in part:

"(an) Employee who <u>drives</u> a truck, maneuvers it at the job as required in connection with the construction, maintenance and operation of electrical overhead and underground facilities" (emphasis added)

The initial requirement then is to get the truck and its added equipment to and from the job site in compliance with the licensing laws of the State and Federal agencies.

Decision

- 1. Inasmuch as the grievants in both cases either have obtained a Class I Driver's License or are no longer in the Line of Progression, the issues in the grievances are moot. However, it is the decision of the Review Committee that the Class I Driver's License is a bona fide requirement of the T&D Driver classification.
- 2. As to those present T&D Drivers who do not possess a Class I Driver's License, they will be given one year from the effective date of this decision to obtain a Class I Driver's License or at that time be demoted from the classification pursuant to the provisions of Title 206. The only exception would be in situations where the work is routinely scheduled in such a manner that the driver's assignment does not require a Class I Driver's License for a specific crew or truck.
- 3. In situations involving drivers other than T&D Drivers where a Class I Driver's License is required and the assigned driver does not possess the required license, either the driver assignment or the load will have to be changed to comply with the State Vehicle Code.
