Review Committee File No. 1284-73-68 San Jose Division Grievance No. D.Gr/C 8-73-20

Subject of the Case

In 1973, San Jose Division started scheduling Relief First Operators on a basic shift of 3:00 PM - 11:00 PM at both Metcalf and San Mateo Substations.

Discussion

Union filed a grievance in May, 1973 protesting the changes, arguing that the Labor Agreement and its related documents, specifically, the Labor Agreement Clarification, Titles 202, 205 and 208, Utilization of Relief Shift Employees, dated November 1, 1967 and the Labor Agreement Clarification, Titles 202 and 208, Hours of Relief Shift Employees, dated November 1, 1967, did not allow the Company to schedule Relief Shift Employees a basic shift of other than Monday through Friday, 7:00 AM -3:00 PM, or commonly known as the "day shift." The parties have had numerous discussions relative to the 1967 Labor Agreement Clarification, primarily the "hours of work" of Relief Shift Employees when not assigned the relief of another employee. The Agreement is clear that Relief Shift Employees have regularly scheduled work hours, workdays and workweeks. However, the Agreement is silent on the actual shifts to which Relief Shift Employees may be assigned as a regular work schedule. Actual practice is clear; relief operators traditionally have been assigned to the "day shift." Subsequently, during the period of time that the Review Committee was considering the case, the parties were in interim negotiations concerning the training of distribution, substation and hydro operators which included, in part, proposals to amend the hours of work of Relief employees in the Electric Operating departments to provide for nonrelief assignments on all standard operating shifts. The proposed amendment was withdrawn prior to reaching agreement on March 25, 1975. The same proposal for all Relief employees was reintroduced into wage bargaining during December, 1975 and it too was withdrawn prior to reaching a settlement.

Decision

FOR INTON:

In view of the foregoing, it is the decision of the Review Committee that Messrs. Brannon, Heiser, Madden and Talbott are entitled to additional pay at the 1/2 time rate, starting in May, 1973 and ending January, 1975, for all 3:00 PM - 11:00 PM shifts worked Monday through Friday not relieving an absent employee. On the basis of the wage adjustments provided herein, this case is considered closed.
