The Review Committee has again reviewed the above subject case in light of your letter of October 29, 1980, and is returning it to the Joint Grievance Committee for settlement in accordance with the following:

As was agreed in Review Committee Decision 1486-80-12 dated August 22, 1980, a Helper performing work described in Sections (c), (d), and (f) of Item 4 of the addendum to the Joint Statement of Facts was in violation of the Agreement. Therefore, the Review Committee agrees to pay the grievant for 4 hours at the Fieldman rate of pay.

This case is considered closed on the basis of the foregoing and the closure should be so noted in the minutes of your next Joint Grievance Committee meeting.

After having reviewed Review Committee Decision No. 1486-80-12, the East Bay Division Joint Grievance Committee referred the matter to the Local Investigating Committee level in an effort to develop the necessary information to effect the settlement as outlined by the Review Committee.

The Local Investigating Committee, however, has experienced difficulty and requires a more specific definition of "assisting" as it relates to the fusion process.

After having once again interviewed both Mr. Leroy and Mr. Clemons, it has been determined that there was no plan or directive that caused them to "trade off" while performing the various individual steps of the fusion process. Both employees explained that due to the nature of the work such a practice is very common. Additionally, both individuals indicated that Items C, D, and F, contained in the Addendum to the Joint Statement of Facts, are two-man work functions that require one man to handle the pipe and one man to handle the heating irons. Both functions were described by Mr. Clemons as being equally important to the fusion process.

Before the Local Investigating Committee can effectively deal with the grievance and resolve it, the Review Committee's opinion concerning whether handling the pipe or handling the irons constitutes "assisting" must first be received.
